### Teaching Background:

Bonjour! Je m'appelle Kim Flewallen. I teach 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade. I have taught at quite a few different schools over the past 13 years. My first year as a teacher, I taught at Oquirrh Hills Middle School in Riverton, UT teaching Algebra and Geometry. From there I spent a year at North Cache Middle School in Richmond, UT teaching Pre-Algebra and Algebra. Next I taught for three years in Ogden School District--two years at Ben Lomond High School teaching Geometry, Trigonometry and Algebra, and one year teaching Adult Ed at the Ogden-Weber Technology Center.

After moving to Utah Valley I took a few years off public school teaching and taught private music lessons from home. I really enjoyed the extra time with my kids! In 2005 I went back to teaching math at Mountain Ridge Jr. High in Highland and realized how much I had missed teaching. There I taught Algebra and Geometry for two years. While teaching at Mountain Ridge Jr. High, an opportunity came up to teach at UVSC as a developmental math teacher for a MAT800 course. I continue to teach at UVU part time as a developmental math teacher teaching both MAT950 and MAT800 depending on the semester. Towards the end of the school year in 2007 we moved to Provo to be closer to my husband's work. I took a new part-time job teaching Adult Ed at the State Hospital and we enrolled our kids at Freedom Academy on the recommendation of the people we bought our new house from. We loved Freedom Academy, and at the start of the 2007-2008 school year I volunteered to be the activities director for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders that the school had just been expanded to include.

I had gotten to know the school pretty well as the 7th/8th grade activities director when a part-time French teaching position opened up. I had been working over the past year on getting my French Teaching Endorsement and was in the right place at the right time to take over the French class at Freedom in February 2008.

During the 2008-2009 school year I was lucky enough to increase my teaching at Freedom Academy to ½ time. I was able to teach French, Geometry, CTE and even a little guitar.
